"I love you too," she said.

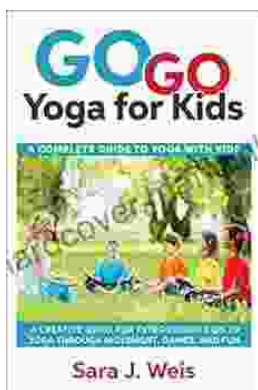
They walked back to the castle together, hand in hand. Aphrodite knew that she had finally found her true love.
